BEFORE ENTERING THIS BUILDING**

The following restrictions and safety precautions apply to all employees and visitors entering and working inside this facility:

- Employees and visitors shall not enter this building, or be allowed to remain in the building, if sick or symptomatic (with fever, cough, and/or shortness of breath).
- Employees must observe strict social distancing of six feet while in this building. Visitors shall observe strict social distancing of six feet while in this building, to the extent possible.
- Employees must, and visitors are encouraged to, wear a face covering over their nose and mouth when entering this facility and when in the presence of others. In the case of retail cashiers, a translucent shield or “sneeze guard” is acceptable in lieu of a mask.
- Employees must have easy and frequent access to soap and water or hand sanitizer. Handwashing or hand sanitization is required before entering and leaving this building.
- All common spaces and shared equipment, including bathrooms, frequently touched surfaces and doors, and tools and equipment must be cleaned and disinfected regularly.
- Prior to entering this building, employees and visitors are required to conduct a pre-screening, including temperature checks and health survey to verify each person entering this building has no symptoms of respiratory illness (fever, cough, and/or shortness of breath).
- No congregation of employees shall be permitted in this facility, except for necessary work.
- No workers who have knowledge of contact with a worker who is diagnosed with COVID-19 shall be permitted in this building and shall quarantine for 14 days.
- Indoor workspaces where more than two employees are working must have good air circulation.
- All employees must have a designated health officer on-site who has the authority to stop or modify activities to ensure compliance with these mandatory health and safety requirements.
